(forwards, backwards, clockwise, anti-clockwise, quarter turn and half turn).</i></p>
<p>Write the numbers 0- 100 in words.</p>	<p>Read the sentences carefully to decide whether they are a statement, command, exclamation or a question.</p>	<p>Practise your throwing and catching skills.</p> <p><i>You could change the distance, use different sized apparatus, and add actions to make it more difficult.</i></p>	<p>Make an observational drawing of a landscape.</p> <p><i>You might want to choose a landscape from the pictures provided.</i></p>
<p>Paint a rainbow by mixing the primary colours to make all the colours needed.</p> <p><i>You can use white and black to change the shades of the colours.</i></p>	<p>Practise your spelling, punctuation and grammar skills by completing the activity mats.</p>	<p><i>Practise forming the letters of the alphabet correctly.</i></p> <p><i>Can you make a poster to teach younger children about the different handwriting families?</i></p> <p><i>E.G. curly caterpillar letters (c, a, o, d, q, g etc.)</i></p>	<p><i>Write a label and sentence for each picture.</i></p> <p><i>How many Year 2 common exception words can you include?</i></p>
